PALMS

Beginning the weekend of February 7/8, there will be a basket provided in the back of church for you to bring your palms from last year. These palms will be burned and the ashes used on Ash Wednesday.

ASH WEDNESDAY

We invite you to join us in church on February 18 for Mass with the distribution of ashes at 8:30 am or 7:00 pm, or a CFP led prayer service with the distribution of ashes at 5:00 pm.

WEEKDAY MASS

Mass will be celebrated in the chapel at 8:30 am Wednesday and Friday.

EUCCHARIST ADORATION

Join us after 8:30 am Mass in the chapel on Wednesday February 25, March 4, March 11, March 18, March 25, and April 1 for a time of Eucharistic adoration from 9:00 am to 10:00 am.

STATIONS OF THE CROSS

We invite you to pray the Stations of the Cross every Friday in Lent (February 20, February 27, March 6, March 13, March 20, and March 27) at 7:00 pm in the church.

CONFESSION

The sacrament of reconciliation will be celebrated in the chapel on Saturdays in Lent (February 21, February 28, March 7, March 14, March 21, and March 28) from 12:30 pm to 1:30 pm.

COMMUNAL PENANCE SERVICE

We invite you to participate in the communal penance service with the opportunity for individual confession on Wednesday, March 11 at 7:00 pm. Priests from local parishes will be available for reconciliation.

PALM SUNDAY

Mass with the blessing of palms will be celebrated at 4:00 pm Mass on Saturday, March 28 and 8:30 am and 10:30 pm on March 29. Weather permitting, the 10:30 am Mass on March 29 will begin at the rock with the blessing of palms and a procession into church.

ASH WEDNESDAY SOUP AND SALAD SUPPER

Explore “Encounter” with Pope Francis & Pope Leo

Join fellow parishioners on a five-week journey
of reflection and conversation!

This Lent, we will be reflecting on the apostolic exhortation,
Dilexi te (“I have loved you”).

Begun by Pope Francis and completed by Pope Leo XIV, this brief document invites us to reflect on the implication of God’s love for us in how we encounter and respond to the needs of others in our world, particularly those facing material and spiritual poverty.

Why is it right for Lent? *Dilexi te* will help us place our Lenten practices of prayer, fasting and almsgiving in the context of recognizing the suffering Christ amid the challenges, griefs and anguishes faced by others and our society.

Why is it right for our parish renewal journey? This series comes at an opportune time in the life of our parish. As we move forward in our renewal journey and await Bishop McClory’s guidance through the pastoral planning process for our diocese, How do we look beyond ourselves to discover the presence of Christ in others? How do we respond to God’s call for all of us to move toward the common good?

Come join us, as we listen together to Pope Francis and Pope Leo’s words, work together to strengthen our spiritual resolve, and pray together to hear and follow God’s call into the future.

EASTER BASKET BLESSING

Saturday, April 4

11:30 am in the church

The tradition of having an Easter basket blessing goes back to Europe in the Middle Ages, when Christians began to fast leading to Christ's Passion. As the church evolved, the people began to celebrate the end of the rigors of fasting by eating a special meal on Easter Sunday that included many of the foods that were avoided during Lent. Around the 15th century, parishioners began asking their pastor to bless this Easter food which was often brought to church in a basket.

Today the food in the basket is brought to church on Holy Saturday and placed before the altar for a blessing. The blessing reminds the faithful that the sadness of Lent will soon give way to the joy of Easter Sunday.
